#### Competence

Competence is the demonstration of skills and knowledge that you have gained through life and work experiences as well as any training that you have successfully completed and that can be matched against industry performance standards. These standards are called units of competency. Units can be grouped together to form specific industry qualifications.

You can have someone assist you with the Skills Recognition process (e.g. interpreter, colleague)

You can have someone with you to assist you with the Skills Recognition process (e.g. interpreter or colleague to advocate for you). Assessment techniques should also accommodate different literacy levels, cultural and educational backgrounds and experiences. If English is not your first language, or if you have had limited formal education, your assessor should consider the fact that you may not be familiar with local workplace jargon and some of the terms used in vocational education and training

#### What is the assessor looking for in the evidence?

The assessor is looking for evidence that is authentic, genuine and current, and that matches the requirements of the Performance Evidence that is eventually mapped to each unit of competency and knowledge evidence.
