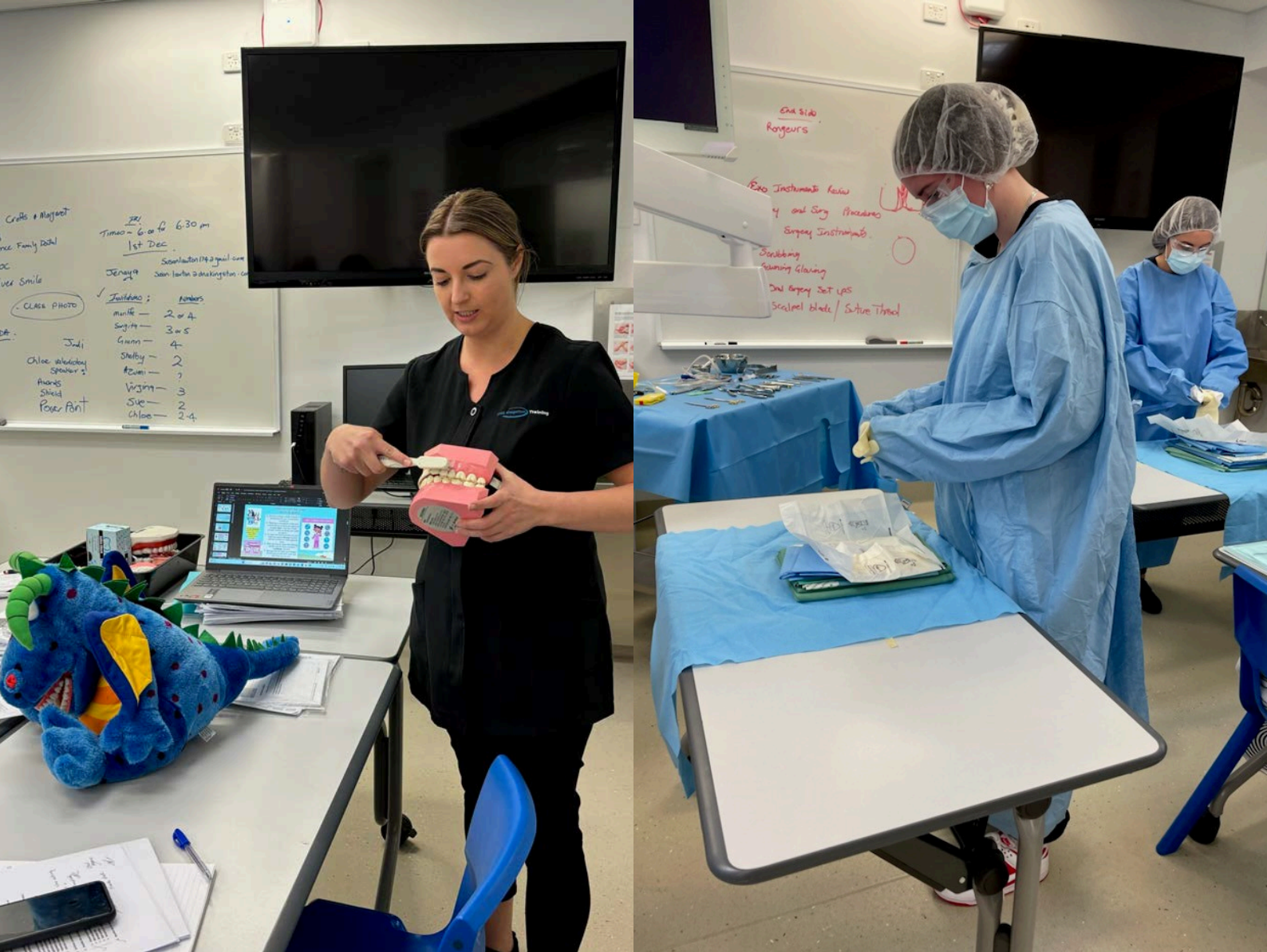

Studying & Living in Perth

Our Vocational Courses all lead to qualifications within the Australian Qualifications Framework.

We offer qualifications from Certificate II to Advanced Diploma level.

You will experience a mixture of interesting lectures, practical sessions, guest lectures and excursions. Practical assessment will be based on real life situations or scenarios in which you will be able to demonstrate your skills. Such assessments may also be based on role plays, case studies and practical exercises. You will be encouraged to access work experience in which we will support you with the arrangements and visit you.

All students are reminded that attendance is important and international students must maintain at least 80% attendance of class sessions.

Accommodation

- Hostels: A room with shared facilities will cost about A\$100 per night.
- Homestay: Living with an Australian family. This is a good way for international students to be introduced into the Australian way of life and have all meals cooked for them as well. Cost is approximately \$540 per week inclusive of three meals per day or \$410 with no meals.
- Shared Rental: Often a cheaper option for students is to share housing. Costs range from \$280-\$500 per week.

Health and Medical Insurance

As a condition of obtaining a student visa, international students are required to obtain the Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC). Please note that OSHC does not cover dentist and optometrist services.

International students on a valid student visa are permitted to work up to 48 hours per fortnight during study periods, and full time during term breaks. Many of our students successfully find part-time work while studying, and our timetables are designed to support a healthy balance between work and study.

It is important, however, that students remember their primary purpose in Australia is to study. Work should not be relied upon as a main source of income. Before a student visa can be granted, applicants must demonstrate sufficient financial capacity and independence to the immigration authorities.

Guest Lecturers

Specialists in their field provide guest lectures through the year, e.g. Forensic Dentistry, Oral Pathology, Orthodontics, Dental Implants, WHS, WHS, industries, Business Management.

English support

There are no formal entry requirements for most of our courses. Please check the entry requirements on our website.

International students must provide evidence of English language competency to meet student visa requirements. Accepted English tests and minimum scores are determined by the Australian Government and must be met at the time of application.

You must have taken the English language test in the 2 years before you apply for a student visa.

- International English Language Testing System (IELTS) - 6.0
- Students with lower IELTS can package their COE with English classes, with one of our reputable partner English language colleges.



Cost of Living

The cost of living in Perth is comparable with other major Australian cities. Your expenses may be divided into accommodation, food and other expenses. A rough guide for one month's expenditure might be:



Accommodation: \$1,500 (share house)



Groceries: \$800



Transportation: \$250



Entertainment: \$250

Total: \$2,800 per month

Dental Assistants (also known as Dental Nurses) play an essential role in the delivery of high-quality dental care. They work chairside with Dentists, Oral Surgeons and Dental Hygienists, supporting both the clinical team and patients throughout dental procedures.

Their role includes maintaining high standards of infection control, supporting practice administration and reception tasks, and providing care to patients. The program is highly practical, with students developing essential hands-on skills through extensive work experience and employment support arranged by DNA Kingston Training, ensuring they are industry-ready.

A Dental Technician plays a vital role in oral health by creating dental appliances such as dentures, crowns, bridges and orthodontic devices. This rewarding profession suits creative, hands-on learners who enjoy detailed, precision-based work.

Students learn to fabricate a wide range of dental appliances in a dental laboratory setting, following prescriptions provided by dentists and dental specialists. The course is highly practical and provides strong technical skills that prepare graduates for employment in dental laboratories across Australia and internationally.

Graduates may work as Dental Technicians, or choose to establish their own dental laboratory as business owners. In Australia, Dental Technicians are not required to hold a registration or licence to work in this field.

The program also introduces students to modern digital technologies including CAD/CAM systems and 3D/4D printing, giving them exposure to current industry techniques. Over two years of study, students build strong practical skills, improve their English communication and gain valuable experience that supports global employment opportunities.

This qualification is also popular with overseas health professionals seeking a hands-on program while strengthening their English skills or preparing for further study in Australia.

Making an Application

Full Qualifications

1. Complete the Enrolment Form for International Students on our website or in person at our Belmont campus.

Alternatively, hardcopy Enrolment Forms can be scanned and emailed, or posted.

2. When submitting your Enrolment Form, please attach copies of all previous education and qualifications you have completed.

International students, where applicable, must provide your English proficiency results (for example, PTE, IELTS). It is very important that you attach this information so there will be no delay in your application.

3. If your application is successful, you will receive an Offer Letter within five working days which will confirm all details regarding your application. We are happy to assist with any questions.
3. To accept your place at DNA Kingston Training, you must sign and return your Acceptance of our Offer, and pay the amount indicated on the invoice in your offer letter. Once payment has been received, the college will issue international students with a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE). This is a form confirming your enrolment with the Department of Home Affairs. This enables international students to apply for a student visa.



Holidays / Short Courses

Overseas visitors can apply by email or phone, or complete one of our application forms to enrol in the short courses and holiday programs. Advice on holiday destinations and course timetables will be advised and arranged for the students, along with further tourist information.

ESOS
